RESEARCH INTERESTS

I am interested in understanding how historically marginalized people are motivated and empowered, individually and collectively, to change institutions so that they better serve and address their needs. Specifically, with regard to California's school finance reform, where urban school districts receive more money, have more flexibility to spend the money, and community engagement is mandatory—the setting is ripe to observe and generate questions about the manner in which families and communities build power, as well as their role in affecting institutional change.

TRU-Lesson Study was a collaboration between UC Berkeley, Mills College, SERP Institute, and the Oakland Unified School District. This four-year project aimed to develop a department-level intervention for high school mathematics teachers to improve teachers' pedagogies and student learning outcomes.

- Conducted quantitative data analysis to address research questions on the relationship between implementation, classroom practices, and student learning.
- Data management included cleaning and building datasets in Stata.
- Data analysis included descriptive and inferential statistics (e.g., correlations, cross tabs, regression analysis, etc.).

The project examined the West Contra Costa Unified School District Local Control and Accountability Plan development and engagement process, focusing on the role that community-based organizations play in building capacity and supporting families to work in partnership with the district. Specifically, the qualitative case study focused on The California Endowment's Building Healthy Communities initiative—Healthy Richmond—to investigate their influence in engaging stakeholders in the oversight and accountability of district-wide funding decisions.
